Personal History

James BOOTH was born at Bolton, Lancashire in 1886 the son of James and Julia BOOTH nee CROMPTON who were married 1882 at St. Mark's, Bolton.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 3, Mortfield Lane, Bolton,. He was aged 25 with the occupation of Cotton Operative Piecer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 45, Vermont Street, Halliwell, Bolton,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Cotton Little Piecer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 8, Rigby Street, Bolton,. He was aged d 5 with the occupation of Scholar.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Good's Manager's Dept at Bolton as an Extra Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Bolton, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 17 July 1915. His last known address was Bolton, Mortfield Lane, 3 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 22 November 1915 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
