Personal History

James Joseph A S BOOTH was born at Preston, Lancashire in 1883 the son of John and Mary Jane BOOTH nee RYAN who were married 1878 at Preston Register Office or Registrar Attended.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 3, Caroline Street, Preston,. He was aged 27 with the occupation of Bricklayers Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 54, Fishwick Parade, Preston,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Cotton Spinner.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 36, Fishwick Parade, Preston,. He was aged 7

He was a married man. His wife's name was Catherine Booth BOOTH (nee HARRISON) They married at Preston Registry Office or Registrar Attended on 19 March 1905. They had children: John b. 1905, Joseph b. 1907, Mary. b. 1908, Mary b. 1910, Marfgaret b. 1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Good's Manager's Dept. at Oldham as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Miles Platting, Manchester when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 4 January 1915. His last known address was Preston Caroline Street, 3 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 June 1916 aged 33

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
