*82793 24th Battalion Machine Gun Corps*

*Killed in action 22 March 1918 aged 26*

*Buried Ham British Cemetery, France Grave I. F. 32.*

***Personal History***

*Frederick BOYLE was born at Darlington, Durham on 7 November 1892 the son of Thomas and Mary Jane BOYLE nee ROBSON who were married 1897 at Darlington.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 31, Brooklyn Place, Armley, Leeds,. He was aged d 19 with the occupation of Clothiers Warehouseman.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Cross Lisbon Streeet, Leeds. He was aged 8*

*He was a married man. His wife's name was Nellie Boyle BOYLE (nee BRAMLEY) They married at Bramley on 30 March 1905*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Low Moor as a Fireman*

***Service History***

*He was living at Bradford, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps at Leeds, Yorkshire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 15 April 1915. His last known address was Leeds, Armley, Brooklyn Place , 31 (1911 Census).*

*He is recorded as Killed in action on 22 March 1918 aged 26*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
