John BRADLEY was born at Maghull, Liverpool in 1891 the son of John and Ann (Alice) BRADLEY nee KIRK who were married 1886 at St. Andrew, Maghull, Liverpool.

In the 1911 census the family were living at The Lodge, Manley Road, Waterloo, Liverpool,. He was aged d 19 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 2a, Manley Road, Waterloo, Liverpool,. He was aged 9
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers
Dept. at Liverpool as a Clerk

Service History

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at the same place. and embarked for France on 7 November 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Waterloo, Manley Road, The Lodge

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 July 1916 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
