*Robert BRANT was born at Goole, Yorkshire in 1898 the son of Robert and Annie Adelaide BRANT nee WELHAM who were married 1895 at Goole.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 103, Wetherill Street, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged d 12 with the occupation of Scholar,.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 36, Byron Street, Goole,. He was aged 2.*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Cleaner*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry at Goole, Yorkshire.*

*He is recorded as Killed in action on 3 October 1918 aged 20*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal*
