Personal History

James BRENNAN was born at Bolton. Lancashire in 1886 the son of James and Esther BRENNAN nee HAYES who were married 1881 at St. Margaret, Burnage, Manchester.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 59, Pitt Street, Preston,. He was aged d 25 with the occupation of Railway Porter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 20 Albion Street West, Preston,. He was aged d 14 with the occupation of Errand Boy.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 10, School Street West Preston,. He was aged 4
He was a married man. His wife's name was Frances Bertha BRENNAN (nee KAY) They married at Christ Church, Preston on 21 March 1905. They had children: Louis b. 1908, Gladys Lilian b. 1910
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Preston East as a Summer Collector

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Irish Regiment at Preston, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 13 August 1914. His last known address was Preston. Euston Street, 46 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 14 September 1914 aged 29

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
