Personal History

Charles Arthur ANSTEAD was born at Bury, Lancashire in 1892 the son of William and Mary ANSTEAD nee POWELL.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 5, Watt Street, bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Carter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Brighouse, Yorkshire, Hall Street,. He was aged 9 He was a married man. His wife's name was Louisa ANSTEAD (nee ENTWISTLE) They married at Bolton Register Office or Registrar Attended on 28 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Plasterers Labourer

He was living at Bolton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Royal Horse Artillery at the same place.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 18 June 1917

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
