George Hunter BRIGHT was born at Chester, Cheshire in 1889 the son of Joseph and Rachel BRIGHT nee POLAND who were married 16/03/1876 at Ranikel, India. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 19, Church Street, Hapton, Nr. Burnley, Lancashire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Railway Booking Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 20, Water Street, Hapton, Nr. Burnley,. He was aged 11 In the 1891 census the family were living at Salford Barracks, Rgent Road, Salford,. He was aged 1 He was a married man. His wife's name was Florence Mary BRIGHT (nee NAYLOR) They married at Burnley Register Office or Registrar Attended on 16 January 1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Booking Clerk

He was living at Brierfield, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Royal Aemy Medical Corps at Accrington, Lancashire. on 1 October 1915

He is recorded as Died of pneumonia on 1 July 1916 in No. 9 Gen. Hospital - Rouen, France aged 26 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
