Personal History

Harry BRITTON was born at Halifax, Yorkshire in 1893 the son of Edward and Martha BRITTON nee EVANS who were married 1867 at Brosley, Bridgnorth, Shropshire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 17, Hockley Road, Brosley, Bridgnorth, Shropshire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Encaustic Tile Packer.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Nelson as a Checker

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Nelson, Lancashire. and embarked for Asiatic on 25 October 1915. His last known address was Hebden Bridge, Bank Terrace 16 (Brother - CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 9 February 1917 aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
