Personal History

Thomas BROOKFIELD was born at North Meols, Southport, Lancashire in 1885 the son of John and Mary BROOKFIELD nee HOWARD who were married 02/07/1877 at Holy Trinity, North Meols, Southport.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 162, Bispham Road, North Meols, Southport,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Fish Hawker.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 162, Bispham Road, North Meols, Southport,. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Fanny Amy BROOKFIELD (nee ROBERTS) They married at Ormskirk Register Office or Registrar Attended on 2 October 1913

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Southport as a Lavatory Attendant

Service History

He enlisted in the Worcestershire Regiment at Southport, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 6 December 1914. His last known address was Southport, Birkdale, Railway Walk, 30 (Attestation).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 6 August 1915 in Gallipoli aged 29

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
