## Personal History

Samuel BROOKS was born at Rochdale, Lancashire in 1889 the son of Samuel and Harriet BROOKS nee CHADWICK who were married 1882 at Rochdale Register Office or Registrar Attended.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 6, Hibberts Place, Oldham Road, Manchester,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Railway Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 29, Melville Street, Harpurhey, Manchester,. He was aged 2. He was a married man. His wife's name was Lena Maud BROOKS (nee WARWICK) They married at St. Mark, Old Newton on 23 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Engineers Dept. at Manchester (Victora) as a Labourer

## Service History

He was living at Manchester, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Rifle Brigade at the same place. and embarked for France on 28 January 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Oldham Road, Hibbets Place, 6 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 16 March 1915 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
