Personal History

Charles AINSWORTH was born at Chorley, Lancashire on O/N/D 1893 the son of James and Emma AINSWORTH nee SINGLETON who were married 1885 at Chorley Register Office or Registrar Attended. In the 1911 census the family were living at 16, Livesey Street, Chorley, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Shop Assistant.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 10, Dole Lane, Chorley,. He was aged 7
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Fireman

Service History

He was living at Chorley, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at the same place. and embarked for France on 2 June 1915. His last known address was Chorley, Livesey Street, 16 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 6 June 1916 aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
