## Personal History

Albert Cecil APLIN was born at Ancoats, Manchester in 1896 the son of Charles and Amelia APLIN nee SHUFFLEBOTTOM.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 11, Coomassil Street, Pendleton, Salford,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Peper Mill Worker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 21, Birley Street, Pendleton, Salford,. He was aged 6
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at
Agecroft as a Cleaner

## Service History

He enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps. and embarked for France on 20 July 1915. His last known address was Salford, Pendleton, Coomassil Street, 11 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died at home on 24 July 1918 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
