Personal History

William BRYANS was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1884 the son of John and Mary BRYANS nee KIRKMAN. His mother died in 1899.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 160. Lightbowne Road, Lightbowne, Manchester,. He was aged 27 with the occupation of Clerk at Carriage Makers.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 32, Heyrod Street, Manchester,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of ? Packer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 6, Mary Place, Manchester,. He was aged 7 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Charlotte BRYANS (nee HEWITT) They married at Chorlton on 29 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Carriage and Wagon Dept. at Newton Heath Shops as a Timekeeper

Service History

He was living at Manchester, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at the same place. and embarked for France on 26 September 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Lightbowne, Lightbowne Road, 160 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 5 May 1917 aged 33

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
