6422 (1st) 3rd Battalion Lancashire Fusiliers

Killed in action 4 June 1916 aged 34

Personal History

George BUCKLEY was born at Bury, Lancashire in 1880 the son of George and Jane BUCKLEY nee HOYLE. His father died in 1895. His mother died in 1895.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 2, Dawson's Court, Rochdale Road, Bury, Lancashire,. He was aged 30 with the occupation of Shunter L &Y Railway.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 6. Back Barrett Street, Bury, Lancashire,. He was aged with the occupation of 11, Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie BUCKLEY (nee PORRITT) They married at St. Paul, Bury on 22 March 1905. They had children: Annie b. 1909, George b. 1911, Martha Ann b. 1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Bury as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Bury, Lancashire. and embarked for Gallipoli on 2 June 1915. His last known address was Bury, Rochdale Road, Dawson's Court, 2 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 4 June 1916 in Gallipoli aged 34

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
