Personal History

Daniel BURGESS was born at Aintree, Liverpool in 1897 the son of Samuel and Alice BURGESS nee ANDERTON who were married 14/01/1885 at St. Thomas, Melling, Liverpool.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 21, Cambridge Road, Aintree, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Greengrocers Errand Boy.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 12, Sandy Lane, Walton on the Hill, Liverpool,. He was aged 4 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Aintree as a Cleaner

Service History

He was living at Aintree, Liverpool when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Bootle, Liverpool. and embarked for France on 7 March 1915. His last known address was Aintree, Cambridge Road, 21 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds aged 18

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
