## Personal History

Amos BURY was born at Darwen, Lancashire on 5 March 1884 the son of Moses and Mary BURY nee WOOD who were married 13/12/1865 at St. Paull, Hoddlesden, Lancashire. His father died in 1905. His mother died in 1905.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Lower Darwen as a Cleaner

He enlisted in the East Lancashire Regiment at Darwen, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 18 October 1916 aged 32
