Personal History

Walter BUTTERY was born at Leeds, Yorkshire on 7 June 1886 the son of Walter and Jane BUTTERY nee MELLOR who were married 23/05/1885 at St. John the Baptist, New Wortley, Leeds. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 143, Newland Avenue, Hukk, Yorkshire. He was aged 24 with the occupation of Railway and Shipping Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 101, Lambert Street, Sculcoates, Kingston upon Hull,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 15, Alexandria Road, Cottingham, Kingston upon Hull,. He was aged 4 with the occupation of Scholar.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Clerk

He enlisted in the East Yorkshire Regiment.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 20 August 1918 aged 32

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
