Personal History

George CAIN was born at Bootle, Lancashire in 1895 the son of William and Catherine CAIN nee CLAGUE who were married 1886 at Holy Trinity, Toxteth Park, Liverpool.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 5/3, Princess Walk, Liverpool,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Railway Company.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 22/1, Porser Street, Liverpool,. He was aged 6

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Liverpool as a Goods Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers at Liverpool, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 3 May 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Anfield, Curate Road, 50 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 21 March 1918 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
