## Personal History

William Armitage CALVERT was born at Radcliffe, Lancashire on 1898? the son of Peter and Jemima Ellen CALVERT nee SMITH who were married 22/12/1886 at All Saints, Elton, Bury. His father died in 1944. His mother died in 1944.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 22, Wolsey Street, Radcliffe,. He was aged 12 with the occupation of A Scholar at St. Thomas School.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 5, Reed Street, Radcliffe,. He was aged 4 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company

## Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artilery at Bury, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 2 October 1918 in 2nd General Hospital - France aged 20 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
