Personal History

James Joseph? CARNEY was born at Kildare - 1911 Cen. Aintree, Soldier Died in 1876 the son of James and Rose Anne CARNEY. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 88, Albert Edward Road, Liverpool,. He was aged 32 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Aintree (Fazakerley Junct.) as a Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers at Seaforth, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 11 July 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, The Brook, Snafell Avenue, 30 He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 9 August 1916 in 87th Field Ambulance Stn - France aged 40

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
