Personal History

Frank ARCHER was born at Bolton, Lancashire in 1894 the son of Thomas and Hannah Jane ARCHER nee SMITH who were married 1881 at Holy Trinity, Horwich, Bolton, Lancashire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 8, Mill Lane Horwich, Bolton,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Machinist Moulders Apprentice Railway.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 8, Mill Lane Horwich, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 6 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as an Apprentice

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Arillery at Horwich, Bolton. and embarked for Egypt on 22 December 1915. His last known address was Bolton, Horwich, Mill Lane, 8 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died on 7 February 1917 in No. 29 Casualty Clearing Station - France aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
