Personal History

James CARTWRIGHT was born at Crewe, Cheshire in 1885 the son of John and Harrit CARTWRIGHT nee WILLIAMS who were married 1878 at Christ Church, Crewe.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 41, Wright Street, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 26 with the occupation of General Labourer in Loco Works.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 35, Manchester Street, Crewe,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Apprentice Engine Fitter.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 35, Manchester Street, Crewe,. He was aged 6 with the occupation of Scholar.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Bolton

He enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Horwich, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 9 March 1917 aged 32
