Personal History

Percy CHADWICK was born at Liversedge or Mirfield, Yorkshire on 25 March 1887 the son of William and Caroline CHADWICK nee RILEY who were married 1873 at Bradford, Yorkshire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at India, Private, West Riding Regiment,. He was aged 25

In the 1901 census the family were living at Dark Lane, Mirfield, Yorkshire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Errand Boy.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Shell Bank, Mirfield, Yorkshire,. He was aged 4 with the occupation of Scholar.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Mirfield as a Ballastman

Service History

He was living at Mirfield, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the West Riding Regiment at Halifax, Yorkshire. on 5 August 1914 and embarked for France on 14 August 1914. His last known address was Mirfield, Wilson Road, 1 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 November 1914 aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
