Personal History

George CHARLES was born at Southport, Lancashire in 1889 the son of John and Mary CHARLES nee SHACKLADY who were married 1884 at St. Cuthberts, Halsall. His father died in 1935. His mother died in 1935.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Station Road, Barton, Downholland, Ormskirk,. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Railway Porter.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Barton Lane, Downholland, Ormskirk,. He was aged 12

In the 1891 census the family were living at Barton Gerrard Farm, Ormskirk,. He was aged 2

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Barton as a Joint Porter

Service History

He was living at Southport, Lancashire when he enlisted in the The King's (Liverpool) Regiment at the same place. and embarked for France on 24 July 1915. His last known address was Scarisbrick, Southport Road, Round Lodge (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 21 December 1917 in Hospital, Dover, Kent aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
