Personal History

Frederick Saul CHEW was born at Nelson, Lancashire in 1894 the son of Charles Frederck and Mary A. CHEW nee SAUL who were married 1893 at Chorlton on Medlock Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1921. His mother died in 1921.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 52, Carr Road, Nelson, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Clerk*
