Personal History

William Henry CHORLTON was born at Marthall, Cheshire in 1895 the son of Richard Henry and Mary Elizabeth CHORLTON nee SMITH who were married 1893 at Altrincham Civil Marriage. His father died in 1956. His mother died in 1956.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 2, Thomas Street, Miles Platting, Manchester,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Warehouse Errand Boy.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Harrison Street, Allerton,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company at Oldham Road as a Drawer

Service History

He was living at Miles Platting, Manchester when he enlisted in the Border Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 14 December 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Miles Platting, Thomas Street, 2 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 27 May 1918 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
