Personal History

Willam CHORLTON was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1879 the son of Thomas and Ellen CHORLTON nee ROWLES who were married 25/11/1876 at St. Michael, Hulme,. His father died in 1918. His mother died in 1918.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 26, Buckingham Road, Levenshulme, Manchester,. He was aged 40 with the occupation of Lithographic Printer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 5, Green Street, Hulme,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of General Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 10, Green Street, Hulme,. He was aged 11 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Elizabeth Ann CHORLTON (nee SHORTMAN) They married at St. Cyprian, Salford on 31 March 1902. They had children: Thomas b. 1903, Elizabeth Ellen b. 1906, Hannah b. 1910, May b. 1911, Frank b. 1917

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Pendleton as a Point Cleaner

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action aged 38

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
