## Personal History

John Rogers CLARKE was born at Lancaster, Lancashire in 1878 the son of James and Catherine CLARKE nee RILEY who were married 1876 at Holy Bolton Trinity, Bolton Le Moors.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 11. Old Hall Street, Bolton, Lanashire,. He was aged 32 with the occupation of Spinle and Flyer Maker (Textile).

In the 1901 census the family were living at 51, Lark Street, Bolton, Lancashire. He was aged 22 with the occupation of Railway Goods Porter.

In the 1891 census the family were living at Bolton and Lancaster Industrial School, Rumwiorth, Lostock Graham. He was aged 12

He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary Hannah CLARKE (nee WILLIAMSON) They married at Bolton Registry Office or Registar Attended on 14 September 1907. They had children: Elixabeth b. 1908 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Labourer

He was living at Bolton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Northumberlans Fusiliers at the same place.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 11 April 1918 aged 39

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
