Personal History

James CLAXTON was born at East Dereham, Norfolk in 1892 the son of Horace and Caroline CLAXTON nee GREAVES who were married 08/05/1875 at Holy Trinity, Tunstead, Lancashire. His father died in 1922. His mother died in 1922.

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Bacup, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 24 December 1915. His last known address was Norfolk, East Dereham, Washbridge, 15 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 30 August 1918 aged 26
