Personal History

Arthur ARNETT was born at Knareborough, Yorkshire in 1891 the son of Charles William and Pleasance ARNETT nee HODGSON who were married 1878 at St. Mary, Northallerton, Yorkshire. His father died in 1933. His mother died in 1933.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 46, Lickey Street, Ripon, Yorkshire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of Railway Motor Car Conductor.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 46, Ring Street, Ripon, Yorkshire,. He was aged 9

He was a married man. His wife's name was Olive ARNETT (nee WOOD) They married at Halifax on 3 July 1915

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Clifton Road as a Platelayer

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Engineers. and embarked for France on 15 February 1915. His last known address was Brighthouse, Clifton, Wakefield Road, 52 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of pneumonia on 14 February 1919 in No. 11 Casualty Clearing Station - France aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
