Personal History

George McAndrew COOK was born at Birkdale, Lancashire in 1897 the son of George and Elizabeth COOK nee LIPTON who were married 08/12/1890 at Christ Church, Waterloo, South Sefton. His father died in 1951. His mother died in 1951.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 34. Forest Roa, Southport, Lancashire,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Newsboy.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 1, Glenrose Terrace, Birkdale,. He was aged 3

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Elland as a Telegraph and Joint Clerk

Service History

He enlisted in the Seaforth Highlanders at Brighouse, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 8 July 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Prestwich, Heaton Park, Egerton Street, 26 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 July 1916 aged 18

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
