Personal History

John Wesley COOK was born at Clitheroe, Lancashire in 1890 the son of Thomas and Annie COOK nee WILLIAMS who were married 1871 at St. Mary Magdeline, Clitheroe. His father died in 1896. His mother died in 1896.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 2, Moss Street, Clitheroe,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Brickmakers Labourer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 42, Brook Street, Clitheroe,. He was aged 1

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Chatburn as a Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the Cameronians Scottish Rifles at Clitheroe, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 11 July 1915. His last known address was Clitheroe, Cardigan Ave, 3 (CWGC.).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 25 September 1915 aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
