Personal History

Harry COOPE was born at Prestwich, Manchester in 1887 the son of Lot and Mary COOPE nee BROWN who were married 22/01/1887 at Stowell Memorial Church, Salford. His father died in 1946. His mother died in 1946.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept at Head Office as a Clerk

He enlisted in the King's Royal Rifle(s) Corps at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 23 July 1915. His last known address was Eccles. Trafford Road, 36 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 10 September 1917 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
