Personal History

John William COOPER was born at St. Michaels, Leeds in 1893 the son of Alfred and Gertrude COOPER nee HIRST who were married 04/08/1890 at St. Michael, Busling Thorpe, Leeds. His father died in 1946. His mother died in 1946.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 4, Badminton Terrace, Roundhay, Leeds,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of No Occupation.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 6, Renfield Place, Leeds,. He was aged 8

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Leeds as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the West Yorkshire Regiment at Leeds, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 15 April 1915. His last known address was Leeds, Roundhay, Badminton Terrace, 4 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died at home on 27 September 1916 in Ampton War Hosp, Bury St. Edmunds aged 23 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal, 1914-15 Star & Military Medal
