Personal History

James William CORCORAN was born at Ashton-under-Lyne, Lancashire in 1895 the son of Nicholas and Charlotte CORCORAN nee MILES who were married 1888 at Holy Trinity, Ashton Under Lyne. His father died in 1906. His mother died in 1906.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 20, Hodgson Street, Ashton Under Lyne,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Labourer at Spindle Works.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers

Service History

He enlisted in the South Wales Borderers at Ashton-under-Lyne, Lancashire. and embarked for Balkans on 20 September 1915. His last known address was Ashton (under-Lyne, Hodgson Street, 20 - 1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 August 1917 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
