Personal History

Alfred CORE was born at Bradford, Manchester on 9 February 1877 the son of Alfred and Kate CORE nee GAFFNEY who were married 27/11/1971 at Manchester Cathedral. His father died in 1885. His mother died in 1885.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 12, Lizzie Street, Pendleton, Salford,. He was aged 30 with the occupation of Railway Carter.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 15, Branson Street, Salford,. He was aged 14

He was a married man. His wife's name was Emma CORE (nee ARMITT) They married at St. Thomas, Pendleton, Salford on 23 March 1905. They had children: Ada b. 19190, Alfred b. 1912

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Managers Dept, at Salford as a Carter

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Salford, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 July 1916 aged 39

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
