Personal History

Henry Eastham CORNALL was born at Fleetwood, Lancashire in 1890 the son of Matthew and Elizabeth CORNALL nee EASTHAM who were married 1877 at St. John, Lytham, Lancashire. His father died in 1926. His mother died in 1926.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 254, Station Road, Bamber Bridge,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Railway Engine Cleaner.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 4, Jackson Street, Walton-Le-Dale,. He was aged 10

In the 1891 census the family were living at 21, Wyre Street, Fleetwood, Lancashire,. He was aged 11 Months Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Lostock Hall as a Clerk

Service History

He was living at Bamber Bridge, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at Preston, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 25 September 1915. His last known address was Bamber Bridge, Station Road, 241 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 16 November 1916 in St. Georges Hospital, Lambeth, London aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
