Personal History

Eli COULSON was born at Adlingfleet, Yorkshire in 1891 the son of William Moody and Mary Ann COULSON nee GARNER who were married 03/04/1879 at Ludington, Lincn. His father died in 1948. His mother died in 1948.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Staddlethorpe Lane, Blacktofter, Howden, East Yorkshire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Waggone on Fram.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 11, Church Street, Adlingfleet, Yorkshire,. He was aged 9 He was a married man. His wife's name was Ruth COULSON (nee GOODHAND) They married at Parish Church, Newport, Yorkshire on 20 December 1911. They had children: Annie b. 1912, George b. 1914 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Goole as a Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Army Medical Corps at Nottingham, Nottinghamshire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 17 September 1916 aged 25

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
