Personal History

Sydney COULTER was born at Islington, Middlesex in 1891 the son of John Charles and Jane Eliza COULTER nee BUMSTEAD who were married 1887 at Islington. His father died in 1952. His mother died in 1952.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 18, Church Street, Islington, Clerkenwell,. He was aged 10 He was a married man. His wife's name was Dora COULTER (nee PENKETHAM) They married at Barton-Upon-Irlam, Manchester on 29 March 1905. They had children: Sydney Benjamin b. 1917

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Manchester (Parcels Dept.) as a Hall Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 10 August 1914. His last known address was Manchester, Cornbrook, Hadfield Street, 18 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 26 April 1918 in 6th Casualty Hospital, France aged 27

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
