Personal History

William John COY was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1896 the son of William and Hennrietta Maud COY nee BARKER who were married 1896 at Our Lady & St. Nicholas & St. Anne, Liverpool. His father died in 1936. His mother died in 1936.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 74, Eastbourne Road, Aintree, Liverpool,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Dairy Messenger.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Sandhills as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at the same place. and embarked for France on 10 February 1916. His last known address was Liverpool, Aintree, Eastbourne Road, 74 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 29 February 1916 aged 19

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
