Personal History

William Isaac Morris CRADDOCK was born at Liverpool, Lancashire on 26 July 1893 the son of William Thomas and Mary Elizabeth CRADDOCK nee MORRIS who were married 31/12/1890 at St. Mary, Walton. His father died in 1936. His mother died in 1936.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 31, Tilney Street, Walton, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Apprentice Electrical Engineer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 3, Dove Road, Walron-on-the-Hill, Liverpool,. He was aged 7 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Seaforth as a Sub Station Assistant

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Liverpool, Lancashire. and embarked for Asiatic on 13 June 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Walton, Rice Lane, 81A (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 10 August 1915 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
