Personal History

Percy CRITCHLEY was born at Southport, Lancashire in 1895 the son of Charles and Elizabeth CRITCHLEY nee EARNSHAW who were married 1882 at St. Michael with St. John & Holy Trinity, Blackburn. His father died in 1954. His mother died in 1954.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Railway Cott. He was aged with the occupation of Towngreen and Aughton, Age 16, Railway Booking Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Town Green, Aughton,. He was aged 6

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line Dept. at Liverpool as a Parcel Clerk

Service History

He was living at Aughton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Liverpool, Lancashire. on 4 September 1914 and embarked for France on 24 July 1915. His last known address was Ormskirk, Aughton, Bold Lane (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 26 March 1918 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
