Personal History

John Richard CROWTHER was born at St. Peter's, Liverpool, Lancashire in 1881 the son of Richard and Eliza CROWTHER nee CLUCAS who were married 24/09/1876 at St. George, Everton, Liverpool. His father died in 1926. His mother died in 1926.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 31, Demense Street, Everton, Liverpool,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Ships Steward.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 76, Potter Street, Everton, Liverpool,. He was aged 10 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Elizabeth CROWTHER (nee MASON) They married at St. Thomas, Pendleton, on 27 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Manchester (Victoria) as a Painters Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 4 December 1914. His last known address was Manchester, Pendleton, High Street, 187 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 2 May 1915 aged 34

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
