Personal History

Francis Edgar CURTIS was born at West Derby, Liverpool, Lancashire in 1897 the son of Francis Edgar and Elizabeth Dodds CURTIS nee MCGROTTY who were married 1894 at St. Athanasius, Kirkdale, Liverpool. His father died in 1886. His mother died in 1886.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 7, Hector Street, Kirkdale, Liverpool,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of A Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 27, Hector Street, Kirkdale, Liverpool,. He was aged 3
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers
Dept. at Liverpool as a Capstan Youth

Service History

He was living at Kirkdale, Liverpool, when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Bootle, Liverpool. and embarked for France on 7 February 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Kirkdale Hector Street, 7 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 16 May 1915 aged 18

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
