Personal History

John DANDY was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1898 the son of John and Mary Ellen DANDY nee THOMAS who were married 1888 at St. Pter, Liverpool. His father died in 1906. His mother died in 1906. In the 1911 census the family were living at 9, Roderick Road, Walton-on-the-Hill, Liverpool,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 37, Arthur Street, Walton-on-the-Hill, Liverpool,. He was aged 3 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Aintree as a Cleaner

Service History

He was living at Aintree, Liverpool when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Seaforth, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 19 May 1915. His last known address was Liverpool, Aintree, Beaver Grove, 28 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 19 December 1917 aged 19

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
