Personal History

Halliwell DAWSON was born at Mytholmroyd, Yorkshire in 1889 the son of Sarah Ann DAWSON. His mother died in 1937.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 34, Hill Street, Ashton Under Lyne.. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Spinnerin Cotton Mill.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 67, Park Street, Ashton Under Lyne, Lancashire,. He was aged 11 He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary Jane DAWSON (nee BARBER) They married at St. Michaels, Ashton Under Lyne, Lancashire on 23 March 1905. They had children: Thomas b. 1910, Lena b.1912, John b.1914, James b. 1918

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Secretarys Dept. at Head Office as a Clerk

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Ashton-under-Lyne, Lancasahire. and embarked for Balkans on 14 July 1915. His last known address was Ashton (under-Lyne, Hill Street, 34 - 1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 30 September 1918 aged 29

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
