4297 (1st/8th) 9th/8th Battalion West Yorkshire Regiment Killed in action 11 July 1916 aged 26 Buried Blighty Valley Cemetery, France Grave I. A. 10.

Personal History

Frank DENHAM was born at Bradford, Yorkshire in 1890 the son of Reuben and Jane Elizabeth DENHAM. His father died in 1920. His mother died in 1920.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 49, Park Street, Leeds. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Domestic Gardener.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 4, Cross Lisbon Street, Leeds,. He was aged 10

In the 1891 census the family were living at 8, Downham Street, Bradford, Yorkshire,. He was aged 4 months He was a married man. His wife's name was Gertrude DENHAM (nee GRAINGER) They married at St. George, Leeds, Yorkshire on 14 December 1913

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept, at Leeds as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Leeds, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the West Yorkshire Regiment at the same place.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 July 1916 aged 26

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
