Personal History

Philip Fred Owen DEVEREUX was born at Long Eaton, Derbyshire in 1887 the son of Thomas Arthur and Harriet Elizabeth Norman DEVEREUX nee CRADDICK who were married 14/12/1874 at Parish Church, Irchester, Northamptonshire. His father died in 1900. His mother died in 1900.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 83. Walton Street, Long Eaton, Derbyshire,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Lace Hand.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 64, Bridge Street, Long Eaton, Derbyshire,. He was aged 13 In the 1891 census the family were living at 9, Midland Terrace, Long Eaton, Derbyshire,. He was aged 3 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Department as a Fitter

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Colne, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 15 July 1915. His last known address was Long Eaton, Walton Street, 83 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 5 July 1916 aged 28

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
