William Henry DUNBAR was born at Newton Heath, Manchester in 1894 the son of Joseph and Mary Elizabeth DUNBAR nee FARRINGTON who were married 1893 at All Saints, Failsworth. His father died on . In the 1911 census the family were living at 6. Peel Street, Failsworth, Manchester,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Mule Cotton Piecer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 4, Milton Street, Failsworth, Mabchester,. He was aged 7
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at
Newton Heath as a Fitters Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for Asiatic on 13 June 1915. His last known address was Failsworth, Peel Street, 6 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 3 May 1917 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
